

Checklist: 12 Things to find out Before You Date Someone

A note before you begin: This is meant to be used as a guide for you to know what you need to figure out about someone before you date them. If the question is a yes/no question, all the answers should be yes. You do not have to have a sit down conversation with the guy, just pay attention along the way and find out a few at a time and then eventually you'll know whether he is a good person to date.

- Is he a Christian? (this is a MUST)

- What is his salvation experience?

- How long have has he been saved?

- What is he doing to actively grow in his walk with God?

- Is he involved in church, school, and/or in after school activities?
[video games and playing on his phone do not count as activities]

- Does he have a stable home life and parent situation?

- Does he put forth 100% effort into all he does (school, sports, job, etc.)?

- Does he respect his parents and treat them well?

- If he has siblings, does he respect them as well?

- Does he have good morals grounded in the Bible and believe that physical intimacy is for marriage only?

- Does he surround himself with positive and Godly influences (friends, mentors, etc.)?

- Does he always tell the truth?
